TRANSITION TO KINDERGARTEN

INTRODUCTION

It is important for families to feel comfortable and happy on their child's first day of kindergarten. Entering kindergarten will be a new experience for your child. The team is here to support both you and your child. This team may include the school staff and any other service providers that are currently working with your child.

You may experience many emotions when your child starts school. You may have questions about school and the supports for your child. It is important to discuss your questions and concerns with your team. Your child may need time to settle into school.

Planning ahead will help your child adjust to school. Beginning early will give your team time to plan a successful start to school. It is important to continue to work together to review progress and make necessary changes. Questions are included in this booklet to help you share information you want the team to know about your child.

INCLUSION AND INTERVENTION PLANS

Most organizations that you have worked with to this point have a written plan outlining goals for your child and supports in place. In the school system, this document is called an Inclusion and Intervention Plan (IIP). You and the professionals involved will work together to identify IIP goals for your child to work toward in Kindergarten.

EXAMPLES OF QUESTIONS YOU MAY HAVE AT A TRANSITION MEETING

- What will the Kindergarten day look like?
- What if my child needs a nap?
- Who do I communicate with at the school (if child is ill, if his or her needs change, if I have programming concerns, etc.)?
- Will I be able to meet with the teacher before school starts?
- When is my child's first day of Kindergarten and what days to they attend?
- Mean How will home-school communication be set up?
- Are the necessary toileting and diapering facilities available for my child?
- How will my child's progress be monitored?
- Who do I talk to if I have concerns about transporting my child to school?

What does your child do best?
What are your child's interests?
What are your goals, hopes, and dreams for your child in kindergarten?
What help (if any) does your child need with dressing, using the bathroom, or other tasks?
How does your child express frustration or discomfort?
How does your child comfort him/herself?
What health or medical needs does your child have?
What are your child's favorite foods and what foods won't your child eat?
Does your child have any allergies, sensitivities, or safety concerns?

GETTING READY TO...

Move On Up!

- 1. Kindergarten registration begins in February for the following school year. When you visit the school to register, it is important to discuss your child's needs with the principal. This is a good time to ask for a tour of the school and identify any questions or concerns you may have with the school facility (ramps, elevators, accessible washroom).
- 2. Contact your support providers (Children's Therapies, Parkland Early Childhood Intervention Program, etc.) to let them know what school your child will be attending. For any professional to share information with a school division, parents must sign a Release of Information Form. Signing the Release of Information form allows the whole team to work together.
- 3. In the spring, a school staff member will contact you to set up a transition meeting.
- 4. You may wish to create a binder to keep all information on your child in one place.

 - Medical diagnosis
 - Family Service Plan/Therapy Plan
 - Inclusion and Intervention Plans (IIP)
 - Progress Reports
 - Correspondence
 - Assessment

KINDERGARTEN ORIENTATION

Most schools organize special days for parents and children to visit the kindergarten class. This is an opportunity for you and your child to meet the teacher, the children who will be in the class, and their parents. Your child will have a chance to become familiar with the classroom and the school.

Individual visits for your child can also be arranged during the transition meeting if needed.

- Prior to school beginning, confirm your child's start date and let the school know of changes that have occurred over the summer for your child or your family (i.e. transportation, health, address)
- Following the first day of kindergarten you may want to touch base with your child's classroom teacher to see how the day went.
- Your school team will contact you to set an Inclusion and Intervention Plan (IIP) meeting.
