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Introduction

The mandate for SCCs is to support improved learning and the well-being of students in their schools. SCCs help to encourage parents and community members to engage in both the learning success and wellbeing of the students. The Good Spirit School Division SCC PD Plan was created to help council members carry out their mandate.

There are six modules included in the PD Plan. Modules 1 and 2 focus on the SCC Operations Manual and helping members to understand what their responsibilities are as an SCC member and to provide members with information on how the SCC operates.

Module 3 provides the background to school learning plans and SCC actions plans which provide the foundation of the SCC. School learning plans are based on the division's strategic plan and provincial initiatives which address the challenges within Saskatchewan's education system.

In module 4, SCC members get an in-depth look at one of their primary responsibilities which is communication. To effectively communicate with stakeholders, SCC members must develop an understanding of the needs in their community and find a way to make parents and community members aware of how they support the students in their school.

Finally, modules 5A, 5B, and 6 look at specific goals within the division strategic plan and school-level learning plans to create action plans that support students with their academic achievement, wellbeing, and graduation from Good Spirit School Division.

Each module includes resources that SCC members can access to support their journey to further understand the inner workings of the SCC and to their contributions to the students, school, and community.
